# Programs

## Academic English (AE)

The AE program is for students planning to study at an Australian education institution. The higher levels of AE are designed for students who need to meet the English language admission requirement of the University of South Australia (UniSA), the South Australian Institute of Business and Technology (SAIBT), Le Cordon Bleu (LCB) or University College London (UCL).

Students applying directly to these institutions will not need to take the IELTS or other English language test if they successfully complete the appropriate AE level program.

Academic English develops the skills necessary for academic study, such as listening to lectures and note-taking, planning and writing essays and reports, and taking part in group discussions and spoken presentations.

Students will normally need to complete 10 weeks of study for every 0.5 improvement needed in the overall IELTS score. Additional weeks may be required if a student's score in one IELTS band is lower than their overall score. This will apply only if a significant improvement in this band score is needed for academic progression.

## Business English (Mixed Program)

Business English (Mixed Program) is offered by CELUSA and is designed for students who have an IELTS score of 5.0 (or equivalent) and wish to study one academic course at SAIBT at the same time as completing a Business related English language program (a total of 20 hours per week). Students can study either a course from the Certificate IV or a course from the Diploma of Business. Business English (Mixed Program) can be completed across three SAIBT semesters. Semester one of the program requires students to complete the Academic course. Upon successful completion, students go on to complete the remaining seven academic courses over the next two SAIBT semesters.

## Quality assurance

CELUSA is accredited by NEAS Australia and is a member of English Australia (EA). This means that we meet Australia's national quality standards in all aspects of our language programs, including small class sizes, highly-qualified and experienced teachers, good facilities and student support services.

## Facilities

As a CELUSA student you will study right in the heart of central Adelaide in UniSA House at 195 North Terrace. Classrooms are newly developed and are equipped with modern lecturing facilities and there is a common room specially designed for student use. You will also have full access to the facilities of UniSA, including the library, computer suites, cafes, gyms and clubs. We have our own excellent library with many books, CDs, DVDs, computer programs and other learning materials. The CELUSA Library is located in the historic Brookman Building at UniSA's City East Campus, only a 5 minute walk away from the CELUSA classrooms.

## CELUSA English Test

All students are required to provide evidence of their English ability prior to receiving a CELUSA Letter of Offer. If you are unable to provide this through an IELTS test, you may wish to take the CELUSA English Test. This test is used to recommend the number of weeks of English language study a student will need to meet the English language requirements of their future study program, or to improve their English language ability for other purposes. ## Services

CELUSA has its own student counsellor who can help you with any personal problems like homesickness or adjusting to a new culture. Our Student Services Centre staff are there to help you with any queries you have throughout your studies. The CELUSA Academic Directorate can help you with academic matters and your teachers will support you with study skills and learning advice. Through our own Student Experience Coordinator you can access a wide range of activities to add to and enrich your learning experience. These activities include social functions, cultural activities, sporting events and volunteer programs.

## Accommodation options

You can choose between many different types of accommodation in Adelaide. Our Accommodation Office staff can arrange for homestay with an Australian family, or advise you on other options such as international student residences, student apartments and shared/private accommodation. There are also some limited opportunities for student residence accommodation. There is a one-off A\$295 fee for accommodation services, which includes homestay placement, airport reception and transfer and on-going accommodation advice. ## Under 18s

If you are under 18 years old when you come to CELUSA there are some special requirements. You will have to pay a A\$220 guardianship fee before you arrive, and you must attend regular meetings with the Accommodation Office staff during your stay. All students under 18 must live in homestay or other approved accommodation.

## Adelaide

The vibrant city of Adelaide is the capital of South Australia. It is a picturesque, progressive city with an affordable lifestyle, relaxed and safe atmosphere, and pleasant Mediterranean climate. With its rich cultural background, Adelaide is home to an exciting array of restaurants and fresh produce markets. South Australia is often regarded as the food and wine centre of Australia. In addition to a number of multicultural, music, comedy and food events and festivals, Adelaide also hosts major national and international sporting events. Adelaide is one of Australia's most affordable capital cities and a popular study destination for students from all over the world.

## Cost of Living

The cost of living in Adelaide is lower than other Australian capital cities. The latest international statistics from the Economist Intelligence Unit shows that it costs 23 per cent more to live in Sydney and Melbourne, 12 per cent more in Perth and 11 per cent more in Brisbane\*.

According to Education Adelaide it is estimated that an International Student in Adelaide needs approximately A\$15,000 per year or A\$285 a week to cover accommodation, food, transport, entertainment and general amenities and communication.
